To address this dire need, we launched the Radiology Health Equity Coalition.


Our goal: To strengthen the ability of clinicians and radiologists to deliver care that follows the six aims of healthcare quality:

- Safe.
- Effective.
- Patient-centered.
- Timely.
- Efficient.
- Equitable.

Just as important, we aim to provide radiology services for every type of:

- Race and ethnicity.
- Care setting.
- Rurality.
- Socioeconomic status.

By joining forces, we can ensure that far fewer people will be at risk of becoming severely ill or dying from treatable or preventable diseases.



Looking back at 2022, our first full year, we are happy to report on the impact that we've made.

We forged partnerships with organizations on the ground to identify and reach underserved communities. We shared knowledge and research about improving health equity in radiology. We connected with influential academic and healthcare groups to amplify our mission even more.

And at 26 members strong — up from nine at our inception — we're just getting started.

- Primary Care Coalition.



Some partners created content for the RHEC webinar series, while others identified volunteer opportunities at the state and regional levels as well as nationwide.





The Coalition in Action

In 2022, Coalition members shared ideas and spread the word. Some collaborations and resources include:

- Our five-part webinar series, "Breaking Imaging Barriers," provided practical, actionable insights for improving health equity. The live and on-demand program reached about 500 radiologists, community health providers and other medical providers.
- The "Community Outreach Guide" demonstrated how radiology professionals, imaging practices and healthcare institutions can pursue strong community health partnerships to advance image equity in underserved communities.
- In collaboration with the Harvey L. Neiman Health Policy Institute®, we completed a research study on racial disparities in mammography screening technology. Our findings were published in the October 2022 issue of the RSNA journal, Radiology.
- We worked with multiple organizations to launch a successful National Lung Cancer Screening Day. Over 300 medical imaging facilities opened their doors to thousands of medically underserved patients.

- Contributed meaningful content in the ACR Bulletin, including the August 2022 Health Equity Edition.
- Posted this piece in the <u>ACR Voice</u> of Radiology Blog: Breaking Imaging Barriers.
- Published articles and made other contributions in RSNA News and the RSNA suite of journals.

Providing Outreach That Connects

Community health outreach connects people and organizations with the resources they need to improve health outcomes and the entire community's well-being. To advance health equity, we help providers focus their outreach on people affected by regional, racial and economic-related healthcare disparities.

We've been expanding key outreach since our founding in 2021. Initiatives included:

- AMA ChangeMedEd 2021, Sept. 26–Oct. 1, 2021: Exhibited Coalition resources to 220 medical students, encouraging them to sign the Commit to Act pledge.
- RHEC website launched in November 2021.

- Mobilization Team Outreach:
 Our physician champions distributed
 Coalition resources to attendees at member organization conferences and meetings, including:
 - RSNA Meeting 2021.
 - ACR Annual Meeting 2022.
 - SIR Conference 2022.
 - AUR Meeting 2022.

 - Oncologists.

 - Cancer researchers.
- Health Equity Grand Rounds Lecture, Oct. 31, 2022: Coalition staff attended the Matthew Walker, PhD Health Equity Lecture at the Vanderbilt University Radiology Department. Following the event, we connected with Katina Beard, CEO of the Matthew Walker Comprehensive Health Center, to discuss improving health equity in Nashville, Tennessee, and beyond.
- RSNA Meeting, Nov. 27–Dec. 1, 2022:
 As an exhibitor, the Coalition showcased resources to 20,000 attendees.
- AMA Health Systems Science Summit,
 Dec. 5–6, 2022: Ryan Tai, MD, presented
 a session titled, "Creating a Health Equity
 Curriculum Tailored for Radiology Trainees."

Looking Forward to Improved Health Equity

Since our founding, the Coalition leveraged the expertise and core competencies of each member group.

Within that framework, our **Mobilization Team** has proved crucial for initiatives such as:

- Contributing funds.
- Approving Coalition frameworks.
